Young People's Groups and the Arizona State Conference of Young People in Alcoholics Anonymous (ASCYPAA) Facts, Aims and Purposes

The following two paragraphs are excerpts from ICYPAA Facts, Aims and Purposes:

“Alcoholism recognizes no barriers, age included. The first Young People's Groups in Alcoholics Anonymous appeared in 1945 in Los Angeles, California and Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. In 1957, a meeting of young AA's from across the U.S. and Canada started what is now the International Conference of Young People in Alcoholics Anonymous (ICYPAA). At the 1960 AA Convention, Bill W. noted that the age of new members was much lower than when he and Dr. Bob founded AA 25 years earlier. A 1975 ICYPAA pamphlet described the people in Young People's Groups as in their twenties and thirties, with some teenagers. The trend has continued. A 1989 AA survey reported that 30% of the respondents were under 40 years of age and that 3% were under 21 years of age. The number of young people suffering from alcoholism who turn to AA for help is growing and the purpose of Young People's Groups, just as it has been for many years, is to carry AA's message of recovery to alcoholics no matter what their age. Young People's Groups provide young newcomers with a meeting where they can see and share the experience of sobriety with other young people”.

“Young People's Groups try to make the newcomer understand that 20-plus years of drinking coupled with loss of family, friends, and finances are not necessary for one to be ready for sobriety. Young People's Groups bring the newcomer into the mainstream of AA Recovery, Service, and Unity through the 12 Steps, the 12 Traditions and the 12 Concepts for World Service carrying AA's message to the suffering alcoholic. Young People's Groups are no way separate from Alcoholics Anonymous as a whole. Members of Young People's Groups are involved in and committed to Twelfth Step Work, Hospital and Institution Work, Public Information, General Service, and every other facet of AA service. Newcomers are shown, by people their own age, that using AA principles in their daily lives and getting involved in AA service can lead to a lasting and comfortable sobriety”.

The Arizona State Conference of Young People in Alcoholics Anonymous meets annually. This meeting provides an opportunity for young AA's from all over to come together and share their experience, strength, and hope as young people in Alcoholics Anonymous. ASCYPAA is visible evidence that large numbers of young people are achieving a lasting and comfortable sobriety in Alcoholics Anonymous. AA's who attend an ASCYPAA return home better prepared to receive young people who come to AA looking for a better way of life.



Salty, black mascara tears pouring down my cheeks, cuts on my hands and face from unknown interactions, during a black out, and then finally sliding onto the cold tile of my bathroom floor and as I gave into the numb darkness of manufactured sleep. This is how most of my Saturday nights ended while in active addiction. Fast forward to a Saturday night, a few years into discovering the freeing beauty that is recovery, and you would find me at home heading to bed with a head full of gratitude and heart full of love. The void that had been filled almost completely, still had a cavernous spot that I simply did not know how to fill. I was not drinking anymore, and my life felt like magic, but something was missing. Let me explain. When I got sober several years ago, I made two friends, a few days into sobriety. They had just picked up shiny, precious newcomer chips too. We called ourselves “The Wolf Pack” and we were instant best friends. We did everything together and we rode the pink cloud of recovery side by side. Well, after about a year I found myself a lone wolf. The other members of my pack had gone back out and my heart was broken. So, I told myself I would never feel like this again. I only associated myself with newcomers that I sponsored and women who had decades of recovery. I was surrounded by spiritual gangsters and I felt safe. When I finally decided to open my heart up to the possibility of having a friend who had less than decades, I realized why a piece was still missing. I knew why the void was not yet filled. I had not found ASCYPAA yet. One of my dearest friends introduced me YPAA, in Phoenix, and I was instantly in love with the vibe. I remembered that recovery could and should be fun. I found myself going to meetings with young people who also had solid recovery. We were serious about sobriety. We work hard, and we know how to have fun too. I owe my recovery to God and the beautiful women with decades, my spiritual gangsters. They gave me the foundation and knowledge that I needed, and still need, and my spiritual gangsters in ASCYPAA help remind me that the passion we have for recovery should set our souls on fire. The ASCYPAA Bid Committee for Phoenix 2019 is the most diverse and cohesive committee I have ever been on. Even when we get a little extra passionate about a topic, we come back together and do what needs to be done in a beautiful, respectful way. We know how to do the hard work and how to have a blast doing it. When we are all in a room together, its electric. I can not wait to help others to discover and rediscover the magic that is YPAA, whether it is their first YPAA convention or their fifteenth. Co-Chair



I got sober when I was 25. I came into the rooms terrified of all these happy people. Why were they all laughing together and smiling? I almost turned around and walked out, except I was there with 3 people that, at the time, loved me unconditionally and wanted to support me seeking help. For that reason alone, I stayed. I got my first chip and I left the meeting. I had no intention of returning. I couldn't get past the fact that I was more than half the age of most of those people. I had no desire to be around people my parents and grandparents ages. I decided to try another meeting with a broader age range. At that meeting I ended up meeting and becoming friends with the man that introduced me to YPAA. I was told about different YPAA meetings around the valley and the events. But I was too scared to go. I felt too young to be around 40+, and too old to be around what I considered "young people". So I didn't get involved for about a year. 
